"Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind;"1 Peter 5:2

How shall God not freely give us all things?

"He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?" Romans 8:32

God asked in v. 31 "If God be for us, who can be against us?"
